Course Description

We will study the welfare properties of the general equilibrium of the perfectly competitive model. We will discuss the possible market failures due to externalities and asymmetric information. We will construct and analyze models of imperfectly competitive markets, such as models of monopoly and oligopoly. Basic tools from game theory will help us in our study of oligopoly models.
