AP/EN 4181 6.A (Y)	Contemporary Literature: Writers and Drugs

Description:	All human cultures have involved relationships with psychoactive plant substances (henceforth referred to as "drugs"). In this course, we will explore the connection between drugs and writing in a variety of cultures both modern and premodern, and the intersections between religious, scientific and cultural thought and practice that go into constructing descriptions of drug experiences. In the first semester, we will study a series of basic concepts that will help us to understand what a "drug" is, and what it means to write about drugs. We will focus on the figure of Dionysus, the god of intoxication, both in ancient Greece and after Nietzsche. We will also examine the concept of addiction in detail, looking at texts by Thomas De Quincey, William Burroughs, Mian Mian and Paul Preciado. In the second semester, we will examine the notion of "psychedelia", and aesthetic representations of "imaginal realms", via texts by Lewis Carroll, Aldous Huxley, Maria Sabina and Tao Lin. We will consider the problems of describing "drug experiences" in different types of media and genre (literature, scientific research, religious and anthropological accounts as well as popular cultural presentations such as TV series like Atlanta and Weeds, movies like Spring Breakers and Into the Void) and the close association of drugs with music, sound and vibration, from Eleusis to Compton. Primary readings will be accompanied by relevant culture studies and theoretical readings.
