Course Description:

This course will focus on topics in recent macroeconomic research including economic growth and development, various intertemporal models, business cycles, inflation, fiscal and monetary policies

Weighting of Course:

Midterm Exam: 30%

Final Exam: 70%

In the case of final exam grade higher than midterm, final exam grade will be weighted at 100%

Missed exams/Tests:

There will be no make-up exam for the midterm exam. In the case of missing midterm, final exam grade will be weighted at 100%
