	Unlike national boundaries, stories are alive and fluid, collecting sights and sounds along their journey. They morph through translation and according to customs of their host nations.
	In the early nineteenth century, Goethe coined the term "world literature" – Weltliteratur – to suggest the capacity of literature to transcend national and linguistic boundaries. He was then engaged with readings from Greek and Latin classics, Persian and Serbian poetry, and Chinese novels. This course is a bold attempt at looking at literature as a single,
	interconnected whole.
