The Winter semester has a start date of January 10 and an end date of April 10. The final examination schedule is from April 12-29.

**Course Description:**

This course undertakes a rigorous study of the theory and empirical evidence relevant to professional portfolio management. Students learn tools which enable them to manage risks, allocate among asset classes, detect mispriced securities, and measure the performance of portfolio managers.

**Delivery Method: (IMPORTANT)**

It is a blended online course. It consists of twelve 3-hour lectures, with 8 lectures being In-person or Synchronous (Zoom) lectures and the remaining 4 lectures completed offline (asynchronous) through Voice-Over-PowerPoint files and online quizzes.

The course is run as a flipped course, meaning students are required to review the Voice-over-PowerPoint slides and other posted files before the lectures. **The lectures will review key points only and hold in-class assignments that apply the information in the slides.**

All files and folders will be posted on eClass.yorku.ca. Quizzes and the exams will also be delivered through eClass for all sections. Please make sure you have access to a computer and reliable internet service.

**Students are expected to attend and participate in the synchronous Zoom lectures or classroom lectures.**

Classroom discussions and student presentations are an integral part of the course and may be tested on the exams. More information regarding presentations is outlined on page 3.

## Presentations

A schedule will be posted at the start of the semester and students must sign up for one of 12 topics. Each topic will have 3-4 slots for student names and students must work as a group. Presentations may be tested on the exams, in addition to being worth 10% of the course grade. More details about the presentations, along with samples, will be posted on eClass within the first 2 weeks of the term.

## Missed Midterm Examination

If a student misses the midterm exam, for any reason, *no documentation is required*, but their final exam will be a comprehensive exam (covering Lectures 1 through 12) instead of the regular final exam, which only tests content from Lectures 7 through 12.

## Deferred Standing – Missed Final Exam

Deferred standing may be granted to students who are unable to write their final examination at the scheduled time or to submit their outstanding course work on the last day of classes. In order to apply for deferred standing in an AP/ADMS class, students must register at
