Description:	This course offers a survey of Shakespeare's major dramatic works and will introduce students to the literary, cultural, and historical contexts in which he worked. As we proceed, we will consider Shakespeare's representations of race, class, sexuality and gender, language, and nationhood, as well as his engagement with European popular literature, English politics and history, and the classical world. We will also explore how his works have been interpreted and adapted in the twentieth and twenty-first centuries with a view to understanding both his enduring popularity and his relevance for today's world.
