GER 3989/HUMA 3989 – Germany and the Global Imaginary

Course Description

This course investigates the international cultural, artistic, intellectual, and social links that have informed German self-definition and the German imagination of spaces and peoples beyond the German-speaking world. Students will explore how this international exchange has influenced cultural production in a variety of media, such as literature, film, visual arts, music, architecture and theatre.

Course Format and Organization

This fully online course is delivered asynchronously. While there are weekly deadlines to complete course modules, students can do the work at the times that are most convenient to them. There are no in-person meetings.
