Course Description

In this course, students will develop grammar, listening, reading, writing, and speaking skills through innovated curricula and interactive digital platforms. Upon completion of this university intermediate level, students will have also achieved the structural and pragmatic competencies of level B1 in standard Italian, as determined by the Common European Framework of Reference for language learning.
