#### Elementary Modern Standard Korean

##### Course Description

An introductory Korean language course for absolute beginners and those with very limited knowledge of Korean. This course stresses the skills of listening, speaking, reading and writing, and includes some lectures and readings on various aspects of Korean culture.

##### Language of Instruction

Korean/English

##### Prerequisite

None

##### Course Format and Organization

In-person sections: classes are consisted of lectures and in-class activities. Each class presents explanations of conversational patterns in grammatical and pragmatic terms and provides students with opportunities to practice in communicative situations with various tasks and activities, utilizing authentic materials such as TV or newspaper commercials, serialized television programming (“drama”) clips, picture books, cartoons, songs, movies, etc.

Online sections: course lectures will be provided as asynchronous pre-recorded videos. Students can learn by watching the videos anytime with the textbook and the workbook. Additionally, weekly practice & Q&A sessions will be held synchronously via Zoom. However, the synchronous practice session is optional, not mandatory. The practice sessions are not lectures. Instead, the sessions will provide students with opportunities to practice speaking and writing, ask questions to the instructor, and interact with other students in the course.
