Description:	This F/W 2024-2025 version of EN 3535.6A explores some themes in Shakespeare's better-known works. We'll be studying the material in groups (usually in pairs, but not always), concentrating first on each text individually and then exploring their relationship to each other.  The groupings are as follows: As You Like It with A Midsummer Night's Dream; selected sonnets with Venus and Adonis; Antony and Cleopatra with Romeo & Juliet and Othello; Macbeth with R III; Hamlet with Titus Andronicus; and Measure for Measure with The Winter's Tale.

Reading List:	Students must use <i>The Norton Shakespeare</i> 3E Edition. ISBN: 978-0-393-26546-0.  No substitutes! The reasons will become abundantly clear as we work our way through the course, but here is one good reason: Hamlet exists in at least three significantly different versions, each with some legitimate claim to authenticity. The Norton 3E gives a combined version of Q2 and F1 (the second quarto and the first folio). It also provides a full copy of Q1, the inappropriately named "bad quarto," which is a few thousand lines shorter than the other two. This Norton edition exemplifies scholarly excellence and the most up-to-date editing techniques and principles.  The edition also comes in a single volume, which you may want to purchase instead of the 4-volume version, but it's some 3500 pages long and very heavy!!
