Description:	This course offers an EXPERIENTIAL introduction to drama, reading a selection of plays drawn from key moments in theatre history. w Students will attend live performances of each play on the reading list, visiting the Stratford Festival, the Shaw Festival, the Canadian Opera Company, and other theatres in Toronto and the GTA. Class discussions will explore the students' in-person experiences of these live performances. Students will also have the opportunity to discuss the theatre productions in person with directors, actors, and designers. By reading the plays, and then seeing them performed live, students will gain a remarkably in-depth understanding of the plays as dramatic works as well as literature.

The cost of tickets to five plays, including bus transportation to the Shaw and Stratford Festivals, will be no extra cost for books; all readings will be online.
