

Course Outline: Advanced Modern Hebrew

Course Description

This course is intended to improve the student's ability to read, write, speak, and comprehend Modern Hebrew. The course presupposes the equivalent of two years of Hebrew studies, elementary and intermediate levels. However, a systematic review of grammar is included, and new grammatical structures are taught. Emphasis is on vocabulary enrichment and comprehension of Modern Hebrew prose through intensive reading, discussions, and analysis of Hebrew words and structures. Classes will be conducted in Hebrew.

Course Delivery

Delivery Mode: ONLN

This is a Full Year course, 24 weeks (12 in each semester). The course will run synchronously (real-time class meetings) with 'live' Zoom sessions, twice a week. Students are expected attend the virtual classes and speak Hebrew during class. The sessions will be recorded and will be available for students viewing.

There will be no in-person interactions or activities on campus. The entire course, including the submission of assignments, participation, discussions, and test-taking, will take place on the course's eClass page.
